

Volunteer FAQs

Who needs to volunteer?

We would ask that each family take a turn providing an adult to help. If mom is unavailable, aunts, uncles, dads, grandpas or grandmas would also be a terrific help! All families are busy, but we would ask that you would take this responsibility seriously.

Why do we need to volunteer?

In one word.....Safety. We want your children to be in the safest possible situations and that can't happen without additional adults on site. Your volunteer hours will mostly be spent monitoring the hall and restrooms and supervising lunch.

How is the Volunteer Schedule created?

Each family at Greeley Options is assigned to fill one day of lunchtime duty. After that there are other volunteer "jobs" that you can choose to do based on your interest/availability. You may tell us when you are not available by completing the volunteer sign up sheet. Other than those days, volunteer hours are assigned randomly.

What if I can't work my day?

Life is busy, and we know that our dates don't always work for you. So, if you find that you aren't available or you have sick kids, please use the directory (coming soon) to find your own substitute. Please don't expect the volunteer coordinators to do your job here. If you have tried 5 or 6 people and you still can't find a sub, please call Amy Dale. Look over the schedule early to watch for conflicts and swap days with other moms whenever possible.

What do I do with my small children while I volunteer?

You are welcome to bring your younger child(ren) with you while you volunteer, but keep in mind we need your attention to be on the school kids. We need you here to ensure the greatest possible safe environment for your children that we can provide.

We know your children's safety is the greatest concern to you and we take our responsibility in caring for them while they are at Options seriously. We can't do this job without your help.
